Preventing and Addressing Racism

The Department of Education has a Preventing and Addressing Racism in Schools policy that all schools must follow. This policy outlines the steps schools must take when incidents of racism occur. Included in this newsletter you'll find information about the process Morwell Park Primary School follows if a student engages in racist behaviour. Please take a moment to read this carefully and, if needed, have a conversation with your child about it.

Student Attendance

As we head into the final weeks of the school year, it's more important than ever that students are at school every day possible. Regular attendance helps children feel connected, confident and ready for the learning that happens each day.

If your child is unwell, of course they should rest at home, but every other day really does make a difference. Students who attend regularly make stronger academic progress and find it easier to maintain friendships and routines. Every day counts at Morwell Park!

Yard Duty Supervision

Student safety is always our top priority. Staff provide active supervision on the yard during recess and lunch breaks plus there are a number of staff supervised activities. Before school, supervision begins at 8:30am therefore we ask that families ensure children arrive after 8:30am and are collected promptly at the end of the day. These measures help us to keep students safe and accounted for at all times.


It's also important that families let us know if they're moving or changing schools next year. Having accurate numbers helps us plan class structures, staffing and resources to best support every student in the new year.







Racism is not tolerated at Morwell Park Primary School

Morwell Park Primary School is committed to fostering a welcoming and inclusive environment where racism has no place. Racism harms students' mental health, learning, and sense of belonging. We celebrate the diversity of cultures, backgrounds, and beliefs that make up our school community. It's up to all of us to make Morwell Park Primary a place that's free from racism, where everyone feels respected, safe, and able to learn.

What we're doing to prevent racism

- Provide lessons that teach about and celebrate diversity, inclusion, and the impact of racism to build understanding and empathy.
- Use teaching and wellbeing practices that help all students to thrive.
- Implement anti-racism strategies to prevent and address racism effectively.
- Ensure everyone feels safe, with clear and accessible ways to report racism.

How we respond to racism

- Take the report seriously and act quickly.
- Report it to the Department of Education.
- Provide ongoing support to the student(s) affected.
- Investigate and respond safely and appropriately.
- Keep families informed while respecting privacy.
- Review the incident to help prevent it happening again.

Consequences for racist behaviour

- First incident: the student will be educated about racism and inclusion in a Recharge session and be supported to apologise to the victim.
- Subsequent incidents: the student will receive an external suspension of up to three days depending on the severity of the incident.

Together, we can ensure Morwell Park Primary School remains a place where every student feels valued, respected, and safe to be themselves.
