Student Reports

Semester One reports will be sent home with students tomorrow, Thursday. Student reports provide a snapshot student achievement and progress against the Victorian Curriculum and reflect where they are at this point in their learning journey.

Due to current AEU industrial action, teacher comments have not been included in this semester's reports. While the reports provide valuable information about student progress, they do not tell the whole story of a child's learning.

Parents and carers will have the opportunity to discuss their child's learning, growth and future learning goals in greater detail during Parent Teacher Interviews, which will be held in Week 5 of Term 3. Information regarding interview bookings will be distributed early next term.

Muck Up, Own Up, Fix Up, Move On

One strategy we use when dealing with mistakes or conflict is the **Muck Up, Own Up, Fix Up, Move On** process.

The most important part of the process is the *Own Up* stage, which involves accepting responsibility. If we can't recognise that we have made a mistake, we can't take ownership of it, learn from it, or move forward. Accepting responsibility allows us to focus on solutions and ultimately move on.

Unfortunately, people can sometimes become stuck in denial or blame. A problem blamed is not a problem solved. Learning to reflect on our actions and acknowledge our mistakes helps us develop resilience, improve our problem-solving skills, and become more successful learners.

Making mistakes is a natural part of life. We all get things wrong from time to time. Success is not about avoiding mistakes altogether, but about learning how to respond to them well.

A reminder that students will be dismissed at the usual time of 3.00 pm on tomorrow, Thursday, the final day of Term 2.

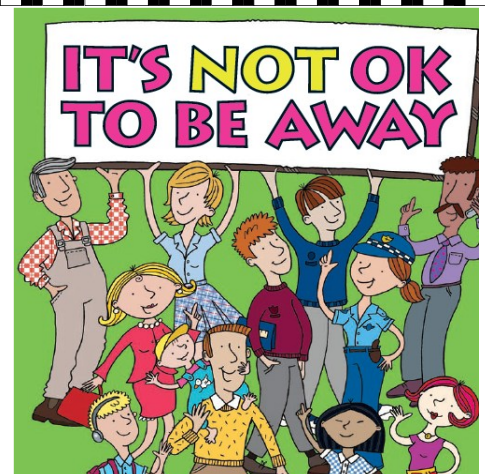

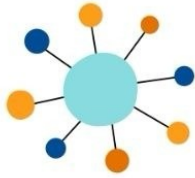
