#### School Wide Positive Behaviour System (SWPBS)



If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- New student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
- Changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commenced at the school in 2020 (which includes a new Prep child).

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
