Mirboo Nth Pool



CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND (CSEF)

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible to apply for CSEF.

If you applied at Morwell Park in 2022, and there has been NO change in your family circumstances your application will be copied to 2023.

You need to complete a new application form if any of the following changes have occurred;

- New student enrolments; your child has started (including new Prep children) or changed schools in 2023,
- Newly eligible: did not apply in 2022,
- Changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number.

A CSEF application also entitles Prep students to a WINTER WARMER UNIFORM PACK, issued in Term 2, consisting of a windcheater, trackpants and shoes. Order forms will be provided when available.

school council elections information for parents Fact sheet 1:

What is a school council and what does it do?

They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers with Ministerial Order 1280 Constitution of Government School Councils, and the Education and Training Reform All government schools in Victoria have a school council to set the broad direction of a school, in accordance Act 2006. In doing this, a school council may directly influence the quality of education for students.

Who is on the school council?

For most primary school councils, there are several possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected parent member category more than one-third of the total members must be from at their child's school providing that they are not this category according to Ministerial Order 1280. Department employees can be parent members engaged in work at the school.
